IMAGING FOUNDATION "FIRST FLOATING CLASSROOM" TRIP TO CAYMAN WILL BE LED BY GEORGIENNE BRADLEY AND WILL FEATURE DR. MAIDA TAYLOR

The Imaging Foundation will be hosting a Cayman dive trip from August 11-18, 2007, led by WDHOF Member **Georgienne Bradley (2006)**. Traveling with a group of female high school and college students, the imaging Foundation will visit and document the Cayman Islands. WDHOF Board Member, **Dr. Maida Taylor (2000)** will be on board to teach seminars entitled "Underwater Physics," "Hazardous Marine Life" and "Outsiders View into Diving Forensics." Maida, a noted expert on diving medicine and women's health issues, has written numerous articles and a chapter in Bove's and Davis' "Diving Medicine." Maida and other mentors will be giving seminars throughout the trip, such as "Women in Diving- ten FAQs," "Fitness and Diving," "Health and Success for Women," "Epidemiology of Female Diving- Who, What, When, Where and Why," History of Stingray City" -Taught by founder Jay Ireland, "The making of a Documentary

Story and Politics," "High Definition Equipment and Gear," "Natural History Photography - How to Get Published." During the trip, The Imaging Foundation will also present a high definition learning experience. Students of all ages will enjoy this opportunity to learn about documentary film making, high definition cameras, and the underwater flora and fauna that populates Caribbean Reefs. The expedition itinerary currently has the team stationed at Bloody Bay Wall for most of the trip. This coral wall begins in a shallow 18 feet before plummeting thousands of feet into the Caribbean Abyss. Team members will be searching for natural history behavior and then recording this behavior for later use by schools and environmental organizations.
